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Carla Marellò is Full Professor of Applied Linguistics at the Faculty of Foreign Languages - now Dipartimento di Lingue e letterature straniere e culture moderne - of the University of Turin.

International PhD at Universidad Complutense de Madrid in 2017 with a thesis about digital lexicography and language teaching.

Socio corrispondente of Accademia della Crusca since 2013.

She is Assistant Chair of the Ph.D.School in Digital Humanities, jointly run by University of Genova and University of Torino. She is presently tutoring in “co-tutela” two PhD students belonging to foreign doctoral Schools (Germany, Spain) and tutored students from Serbia, France, Switzerland till they obtain their PhD.

She has published extensively on bilingual and plurilingual lexicography, lexicology, and theoretical and applied linguistics; she was associate editor of the International Journal of Lexicography (Oxford University Press) till 2016, and series editor at Zanichelli, Guerra, Edizioni dell'Orso publishing houses. Series at Guerra and Edizioni dell'Orso have an international scientific committee and are peer reviewed. She wrote or edited 17 books e 145 papers (40 in journals or series abroad).
